

## How to Apply

The Illinois Home Weatherization Assistance Program (IHWAP) helps low income residents and households conserve fuel and reduce energy costs by making their homes and apartments more energy efficient. IHWAP also provides many health and safety upgrades ensuring safe and healthy homes. Energy conservation and health and safety measures provided through home weatherization can ensure citizens have access to more affordable energy services. **The WEEOC Weatherization Program works off a Waiting List. Applicants are called based on date placed on list and whether they are disabled or over the age of 60. This list is currently closed except in Monroe County.**

Weatherization services that can be funded through IHWAP include:

- Air sealing
- Attic and wall insulation
- HVAC repair or replacement
- Water heater repair or replacement
- Electric base load reduction (lighting and refrigerator replacement)
- Ventilation and moisture control measures (and other health and safety measures)

- **200% level:** For each household member over 12 add \$10,760.
- **60% of State Median Income (State):** For each additional member above 12 persons, add \$2,198.
